Asian Hornet Update

ore sightings of the Asin hornet have now been confirmed in the UK this year than in all previous years combined!

Defra has now advised (at the time of writing) 58 nests have been found in 46 locations. Kent and Essex are the favoured locations but there have also been sightings in North Yorkshire, Surrey, London, Hampshire and East Sussex.

Over the weekend of 23rd September there was an unverified report of an Asian hornet sighting on the coast just west of Littlehampton which the NBU was monitoring. If this is verified it will be the first sighting in West Sussex.

Members should remain vigilant around their hives and in the vicinity of ivy which is now coming into full bloom. Hopefully, bait stations are in place and being regularly monitored. Use the Asian Hornet Watch App to report any suspected sightings with a photograph.

The BBKA has recent funded a month's poster campaign on the back of buses in the areas of Kent, Devon, Southampton and the New Forest from 25th September. It is hoped the trustees may agree to fund a wider campaign in the near future.


Honey has been enjoyed all over the world for centuries, it was found in the Egyptian tombs and is often depicted being collected by bees in ancient cave drawings.

Chairman's Chat



Chairman, Roger Patterson writes for the County News.

have just returned from Serbia, where I was invited to speak at the Southeast Balkan Beekeeping Fair in Vranje. With two other beekeepers, I took the opportunity to visit several beekeepers throughout the country. When visiting other beekeepers, it is interesting to see that different equipment and methods are used to achieve the same thing.

We think that we are overstocked with bees, but the bee density from what I saw in Serbia is very much higher, resulting in very little natural pollen in combs and

beekeepers having to feed pollen.

There were probably 70-80 trade stands at the fair, many selling the same goods, but the aisles were packed with eager buyers, with many stands packing up in the early afternoon because they had sold out.

It doesn't matter where you go in the world, even if only locally, beekeepers are always willing to speak about bees. The Serbian beekeepers gave us a great welcome and were free with information on how they keep their bees.

Research into the Wax Moth

The University of Exeter who works with Wax moths (Galleria Mellonella) are very interested in investigating how wax moths may spread disease around bee hives and so are trying to collect samples of wax moth larvae from beekeepers.

The BBC is also producing a programme in October looking at the wax moth larvae's ability to digest plastic. Their saliva can 'dissolve' plastic as those of us with polyhives can confirm!

The research started in Spain where they are working to isolate the active proteins in the larvae's saliva. It is reported that 1 hour's exposure to the saliva degrades the plastic as much as years



of weathering. They hope this will lead to natural approaches to deal with plastic pollution.

The BBC had approached the Association in the hope of obtaining larvae for their planned programme from our members.
